
Regional average earnings per job are **\$16.8K below** the national average earnings of \$62.1K per job.

As of 2016 the region's population increased by 0.2% since 2011, growing by 92. Population is expected to increase by 0.0% between 2016 and 2021, adding 2.

From 2011 to 2016, jobs increased by 11.6% in Mercer County, OH from 19,433 to 21,689. This change outpaced the national growth rate of 8.8% by 2.8%. As the number of jobs increased, the labor force participation rate increased from 68.0% to 70.9% between 2011 and 2016.

Concerning educational attainment, **9.7% of Mercer**County, OH residents possess a Bachelor's Degree
(8.7% below the national average), and **8.9% hold an**Associate's Degree (1.0% above the national average).

The top three industries in 2016 are Education and Hospitals (Local Government), Animal Slaughtering and Processing, and Motor Vehicle Parts Manufacturing.










Unemployment Rate Trends


Millennials

Mercer County, OH has 2,769 veterans. The national average for an area this size is 2,403.




Retiring Soon

Property Crime


Mercer County, OH has 10.48 property crimes per 1,000 people. The national rate is 24.22 per 1,000 people.







Educational Pipeline

In 2016, there were 127 graduates in Mercer County, OH. This pipeline has shrunk by 20% over the last 5 years. The highest share of these graduates come from "Business Administration and Management, General", "Management Information Systems, General", and Early Childhood Education and Teaching.
