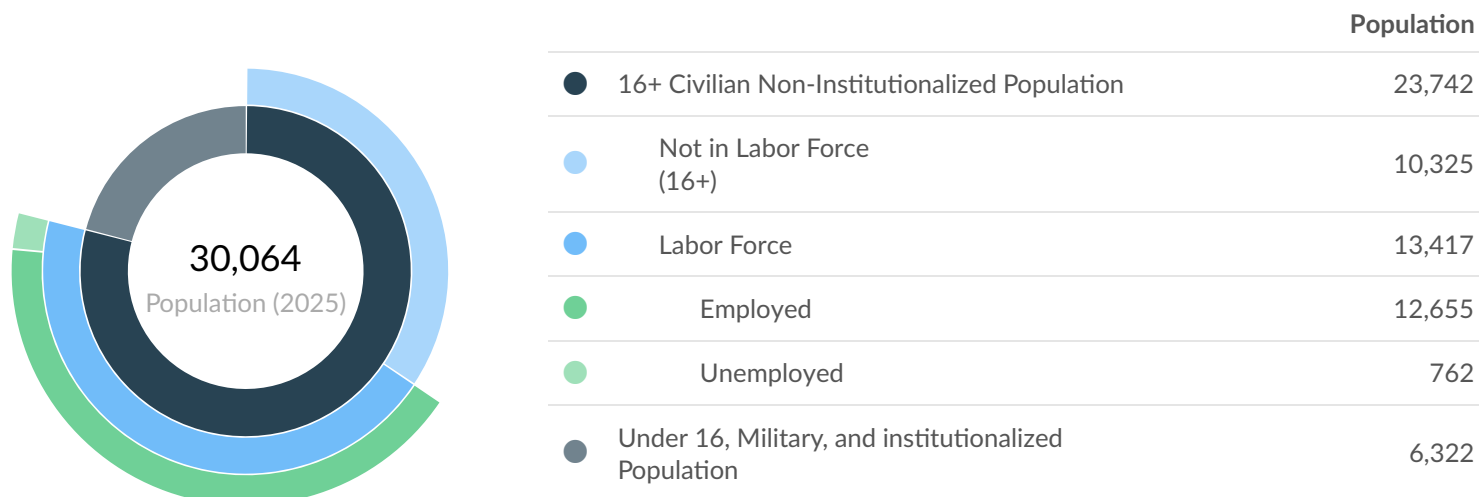
Median household income is **\$20.5K below** the national median household income of \$78.5K.

Takeaways

- As of 2024 the region's population **declined by 3.6%** since 2019, falling by 1,144. Population is expected to **decrease by 2.7%** between 2024 and 2029, losing 806.
- From 2019 to 2024, jobs **declined by 6.1%** in Hardin County, OH from 9,626 to **9,040**. This change **fell short of the national growth rate of 4.3% by 10.4%**. As the number of jobs declined, the **labor force participation rate decreased from 57.7% to 55.8% between 2019 and 2024**.
- Concerning educational attainment, **13.5% of Hardin County, OH residents possess a Bachelor's Degree** (8.0% below the national average), and **8.6% hold an Associate's Degree** (0.3% below the national average).
- The top three industries in 2024 are Colleges, Universities, and Professional Schools, Education and Hospitals (Local Government), and Restaurants and Other Eating Places.

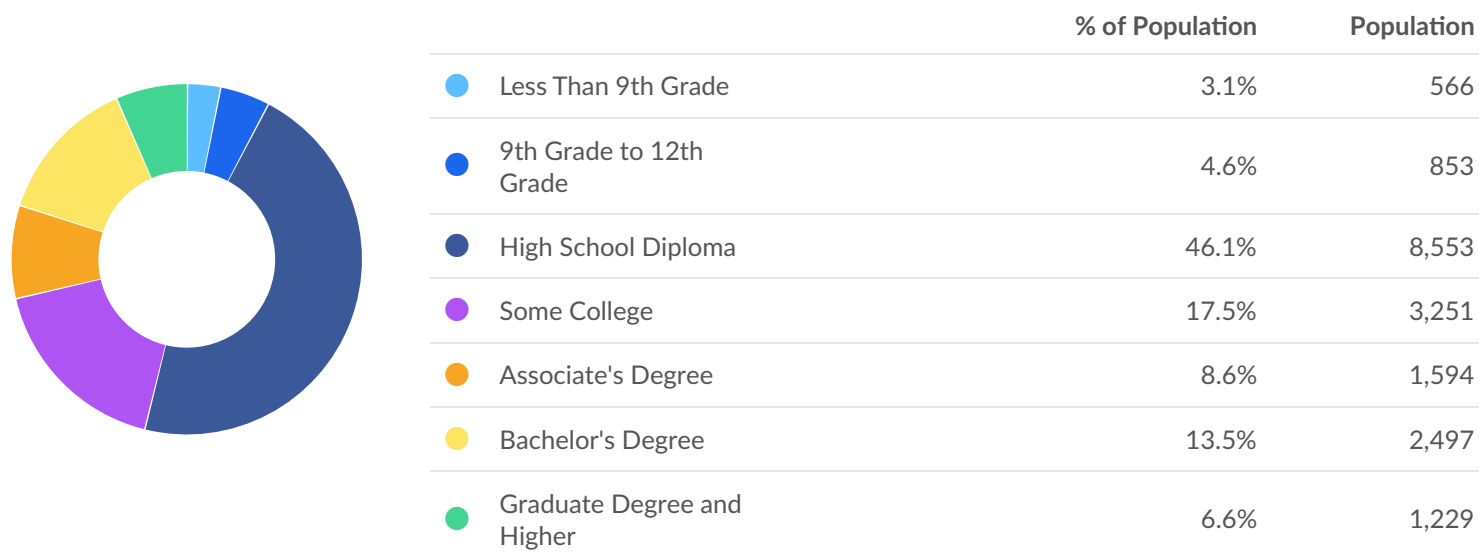

Jun 2025 Labor Force Breakdown



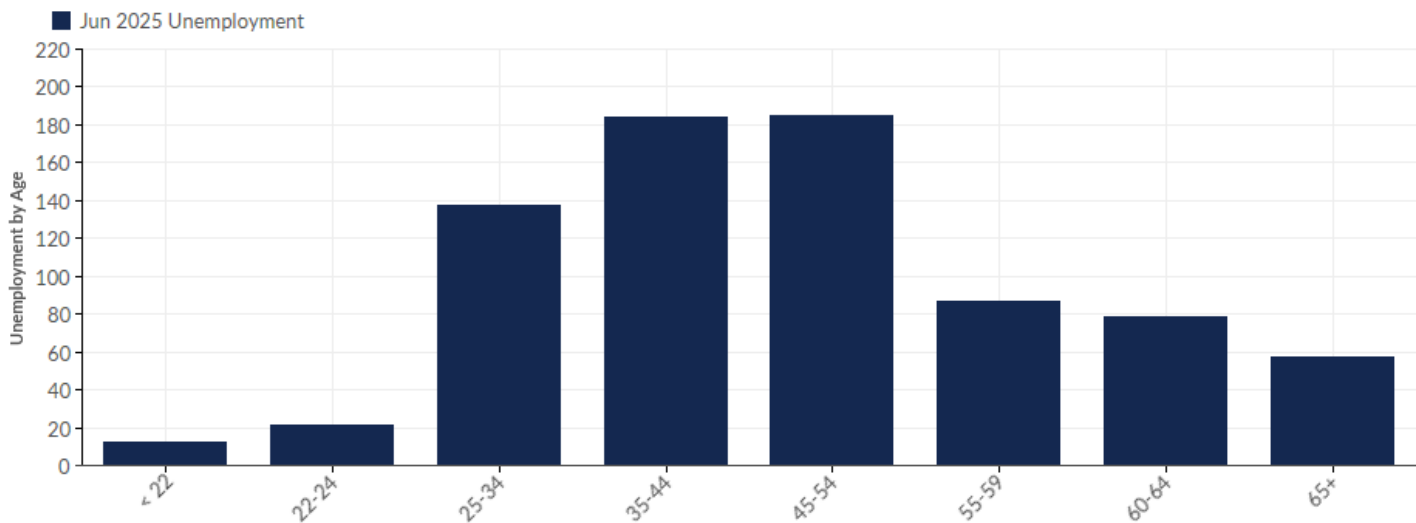
Educational Attainment

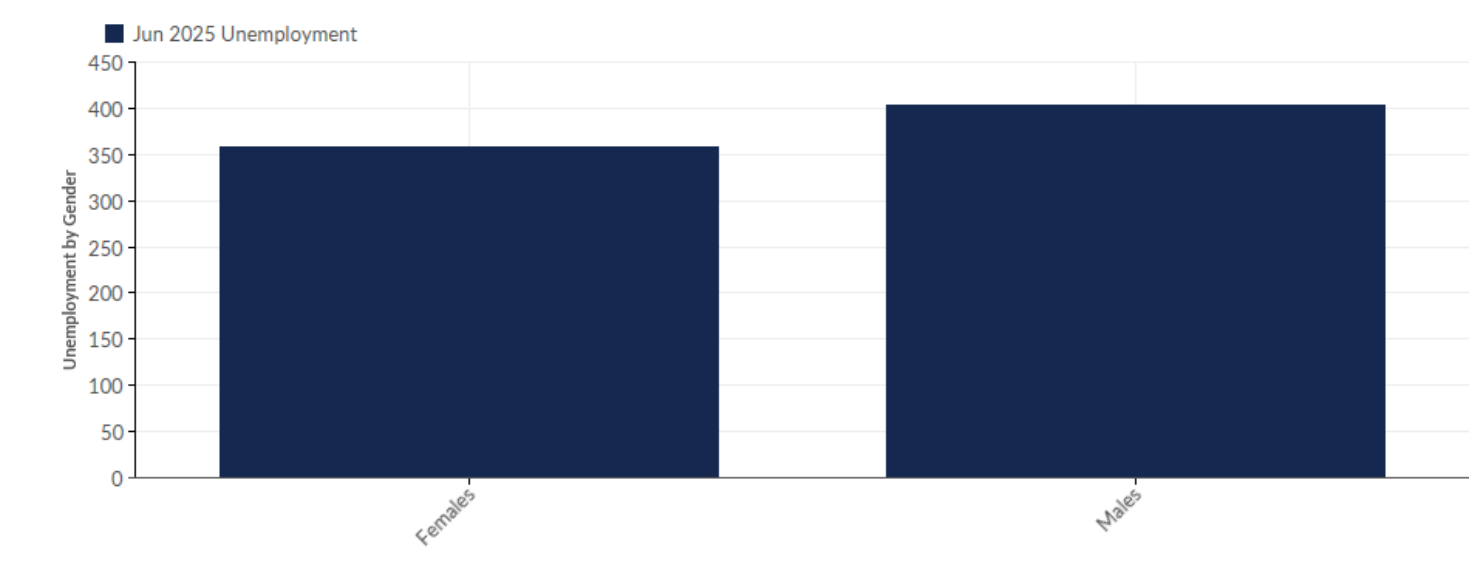

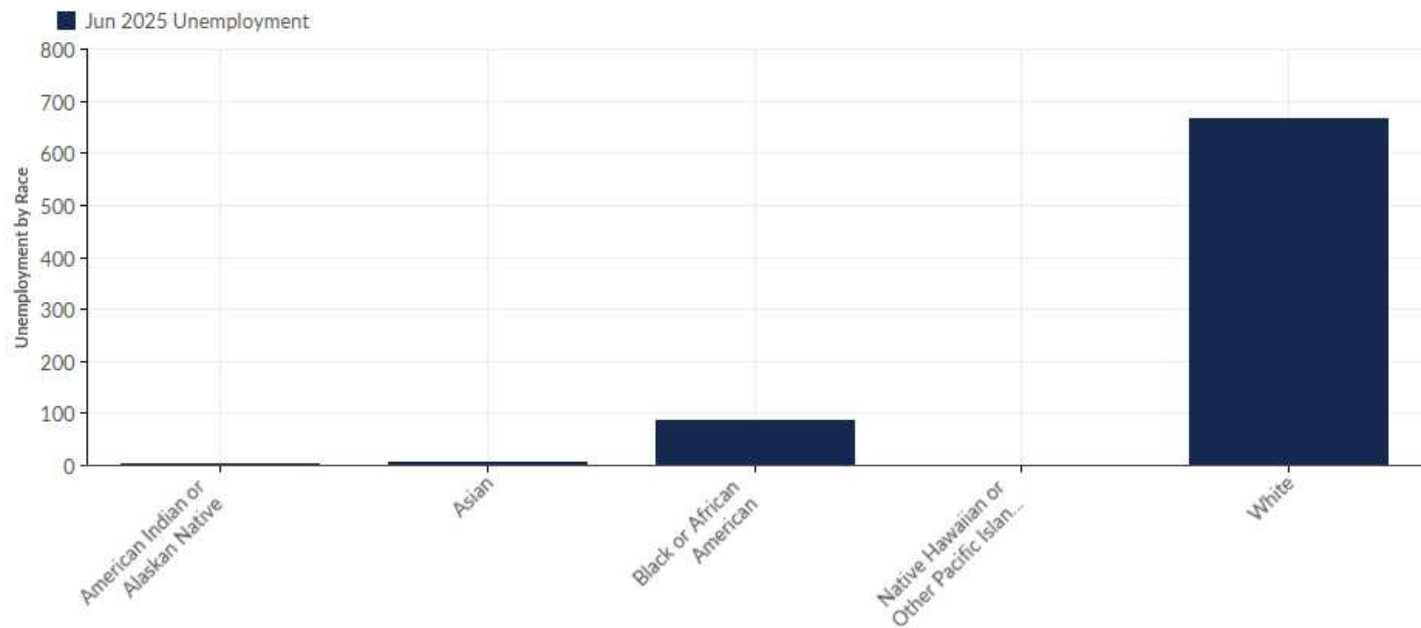

Unemployment by Gender



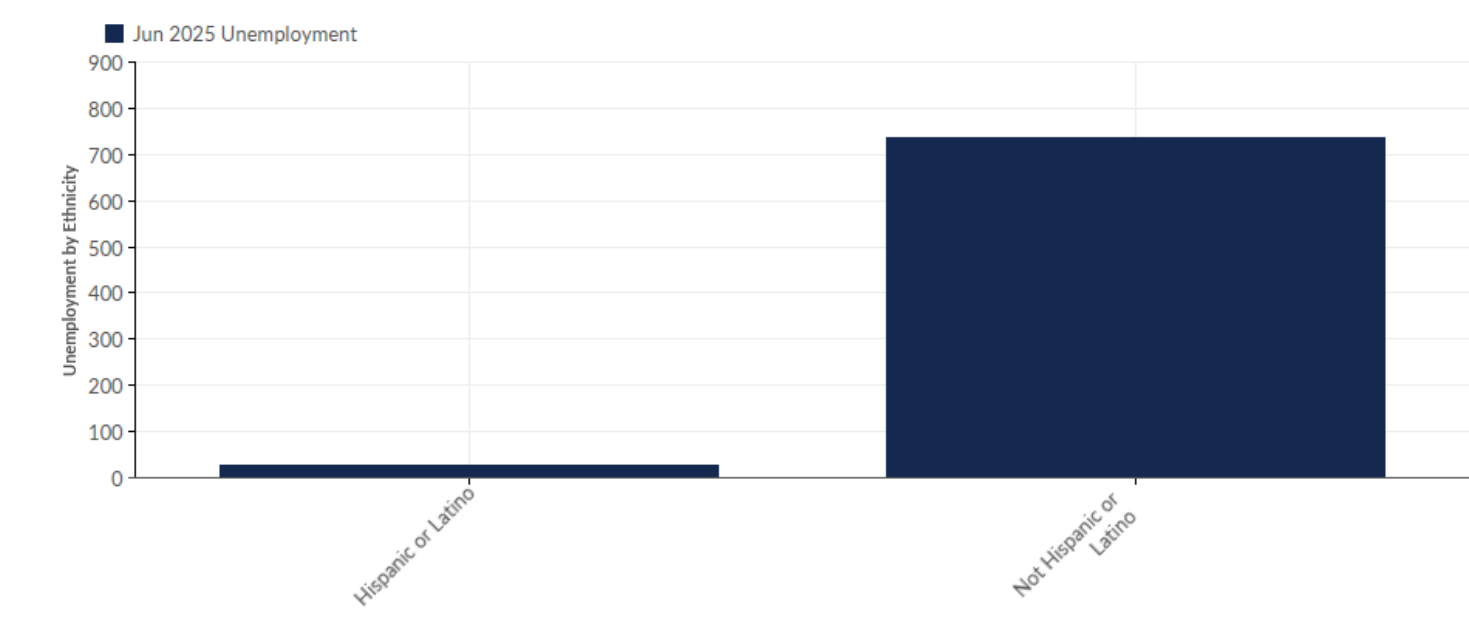

Unemployment by Ethnicity

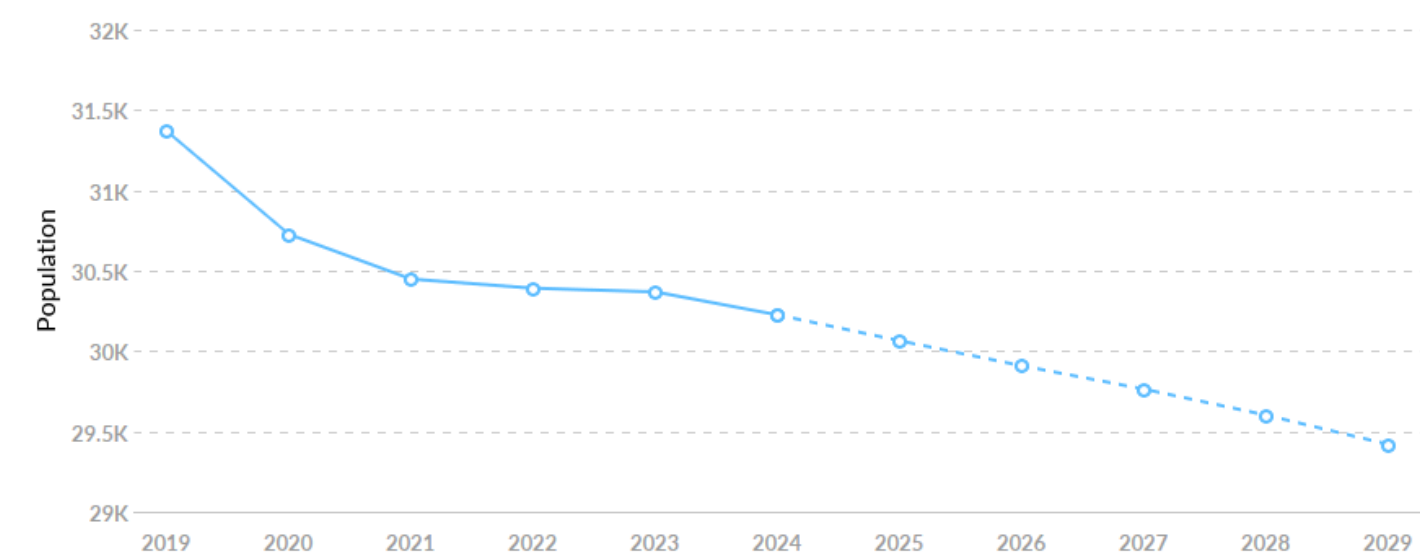

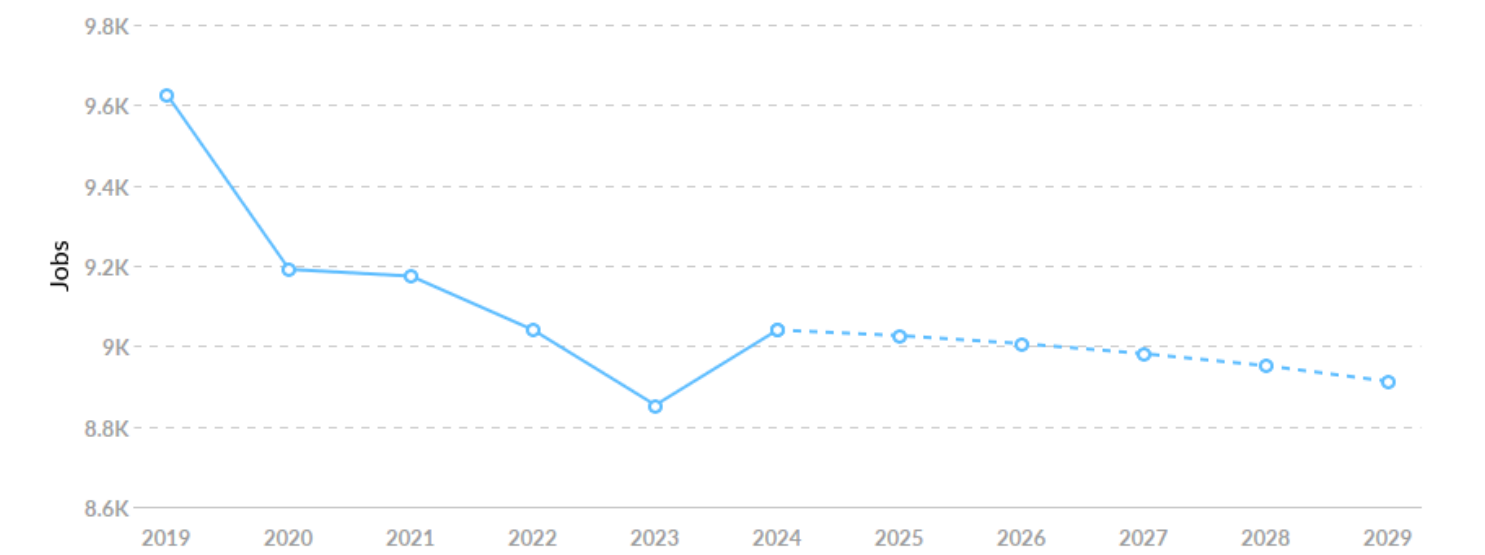

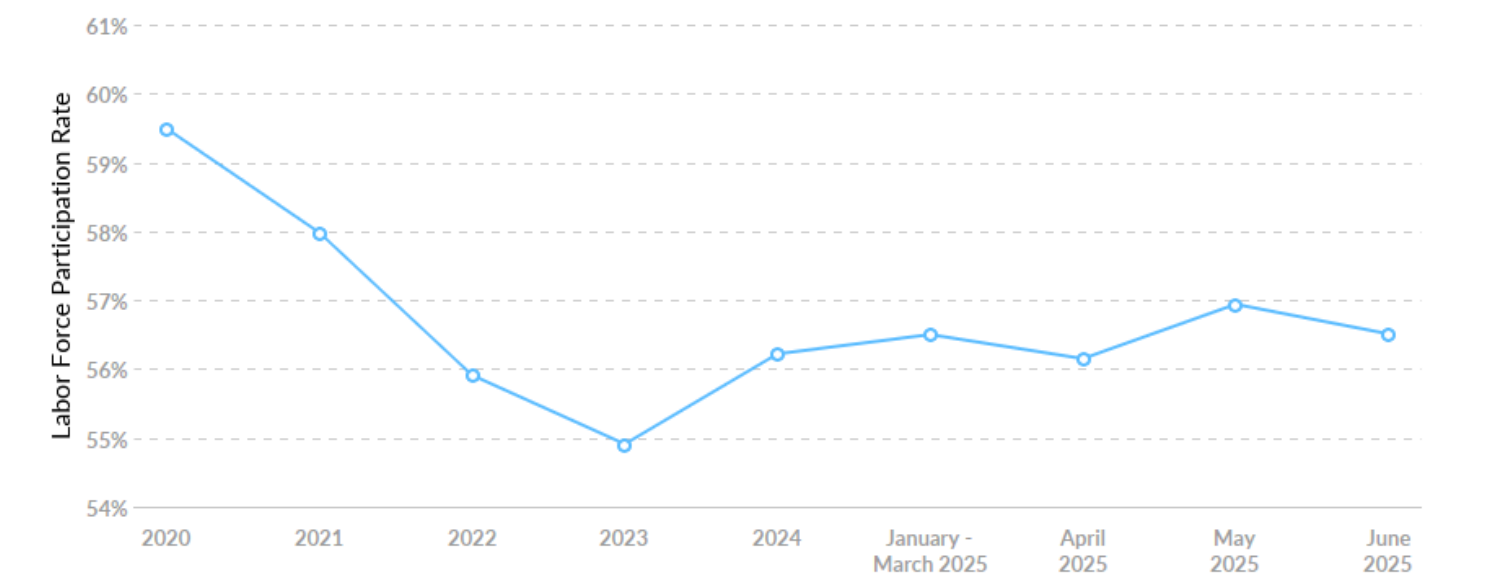
Job Trends

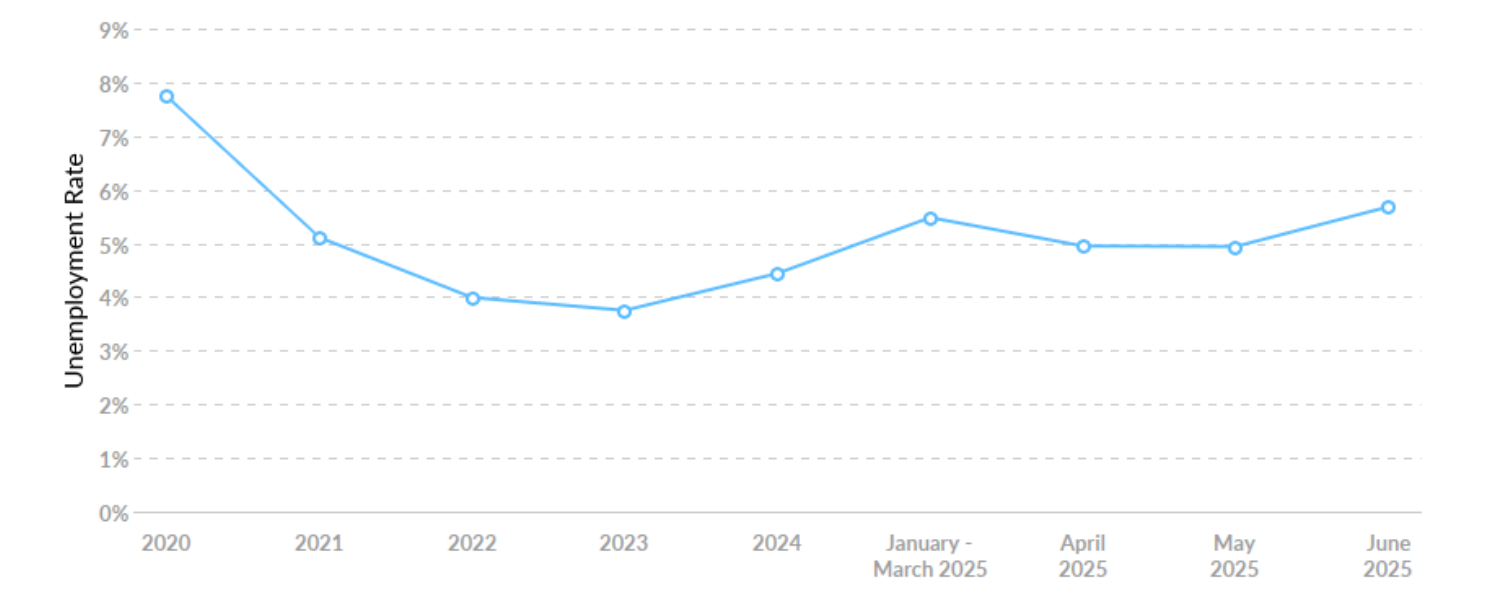

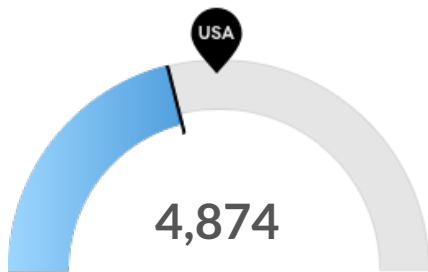
Unemployment Rate Trends

Hardin County, OH had a June 2025 unemployment rate of 5.68%, **decreasing from 7.74%** 5 years before.



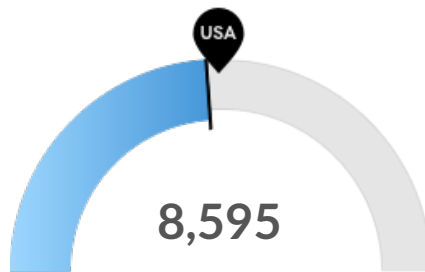

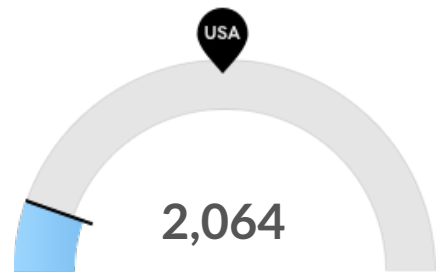
Millennials

Hardin County, OH has 4,874 millennials (ages 25-39). The national average for an area this size is 6,170.



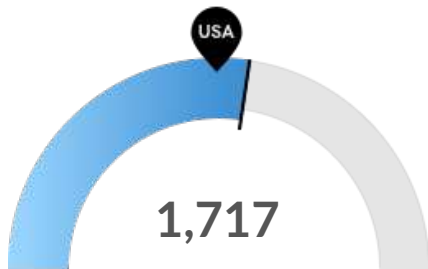
Retiring Soon

Retirement risk is about average in Hardin County, OH. The national average for an area this size is 9,167 people 55 or older, while there are 8,595 here.



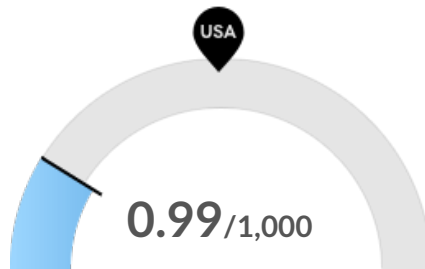
Racial Diversity

Racial diversity is low in Hardin County, OH. The national average for an area this size is 12,647 racially diverse people, while there are 2,064 here.



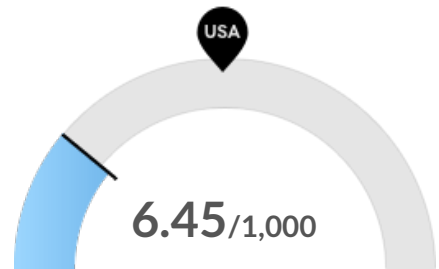
Veterans

Hardin County, OH has 0.99 violent crimes per 1,000 people. The national rate is 3.54 per 1,000 people.

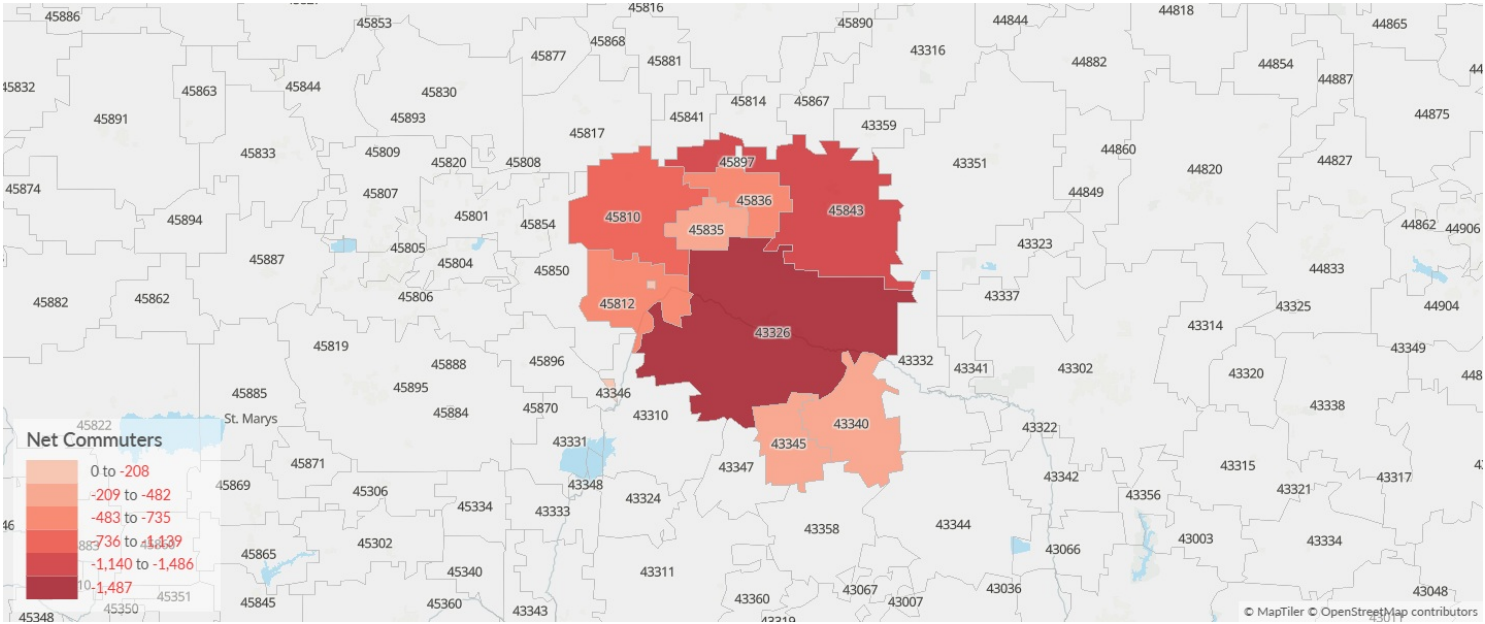


Property Crime

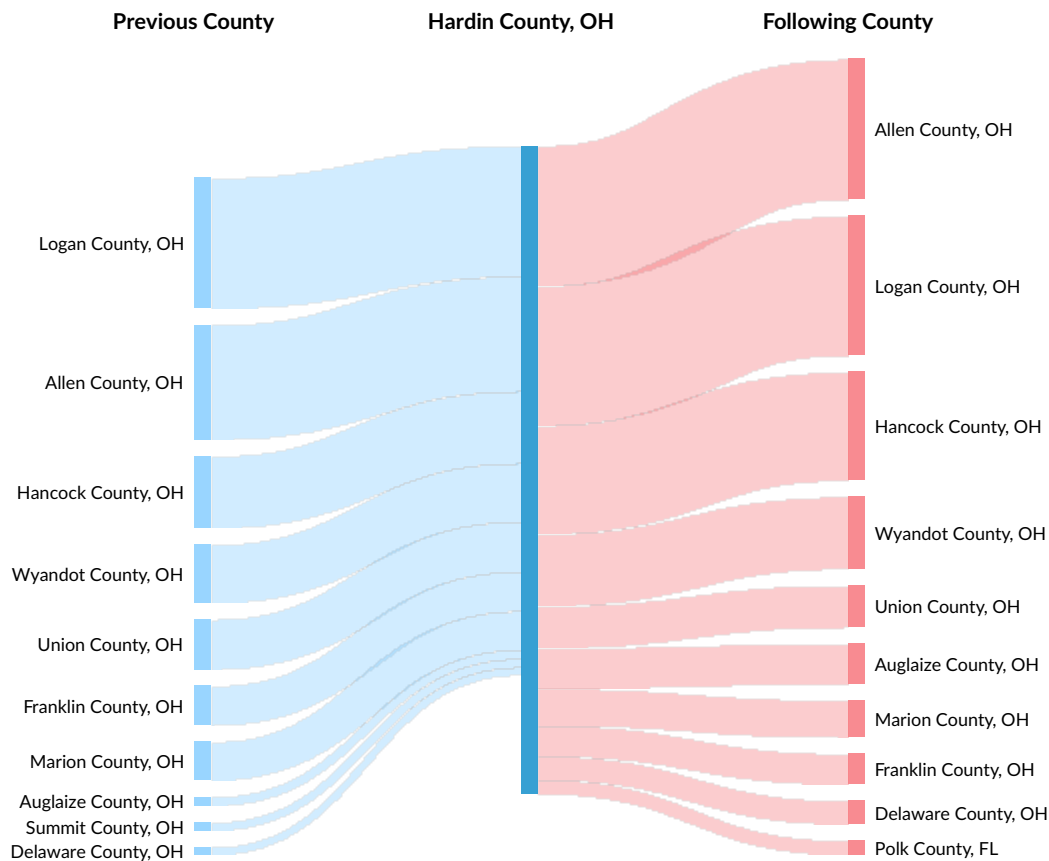

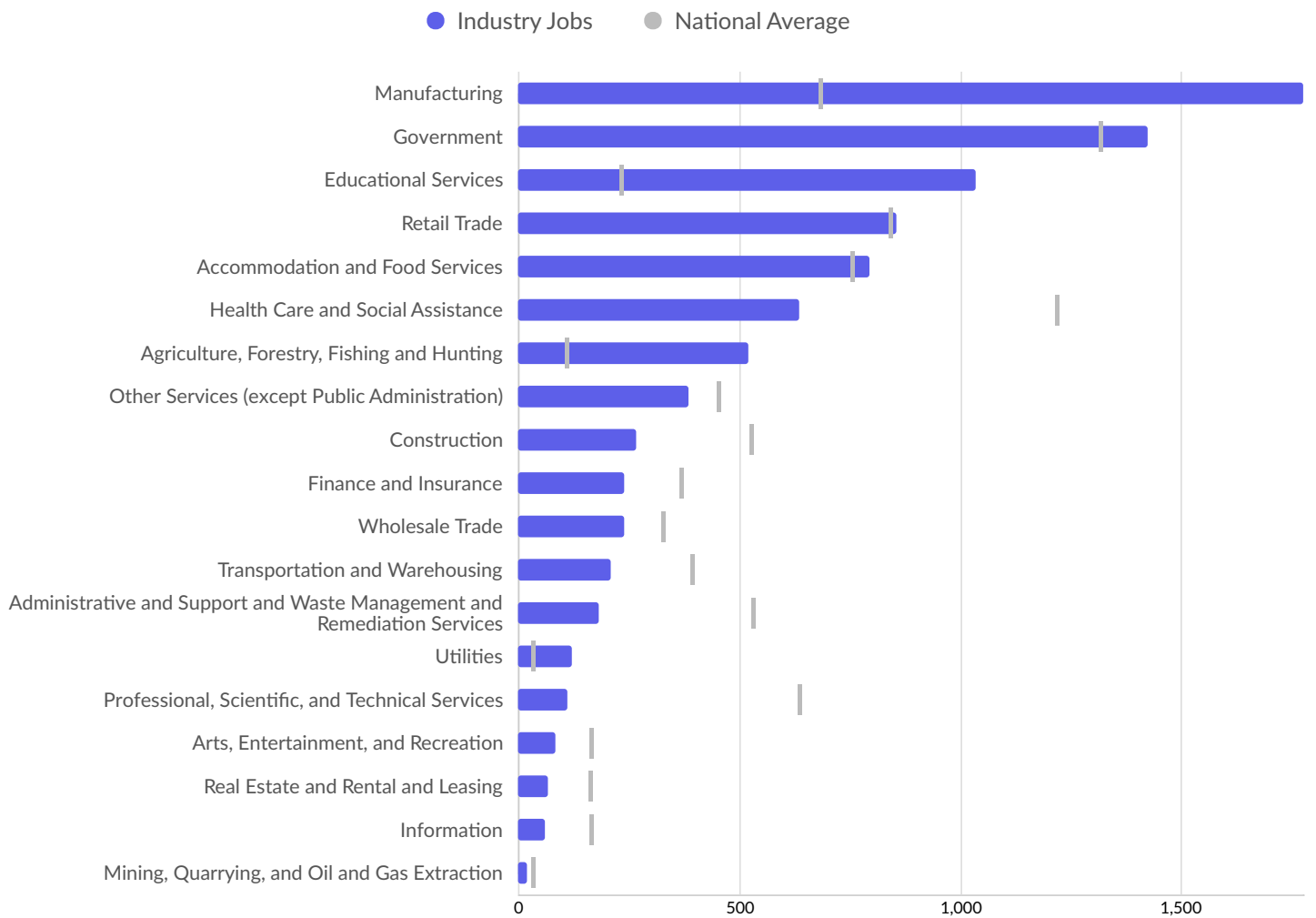

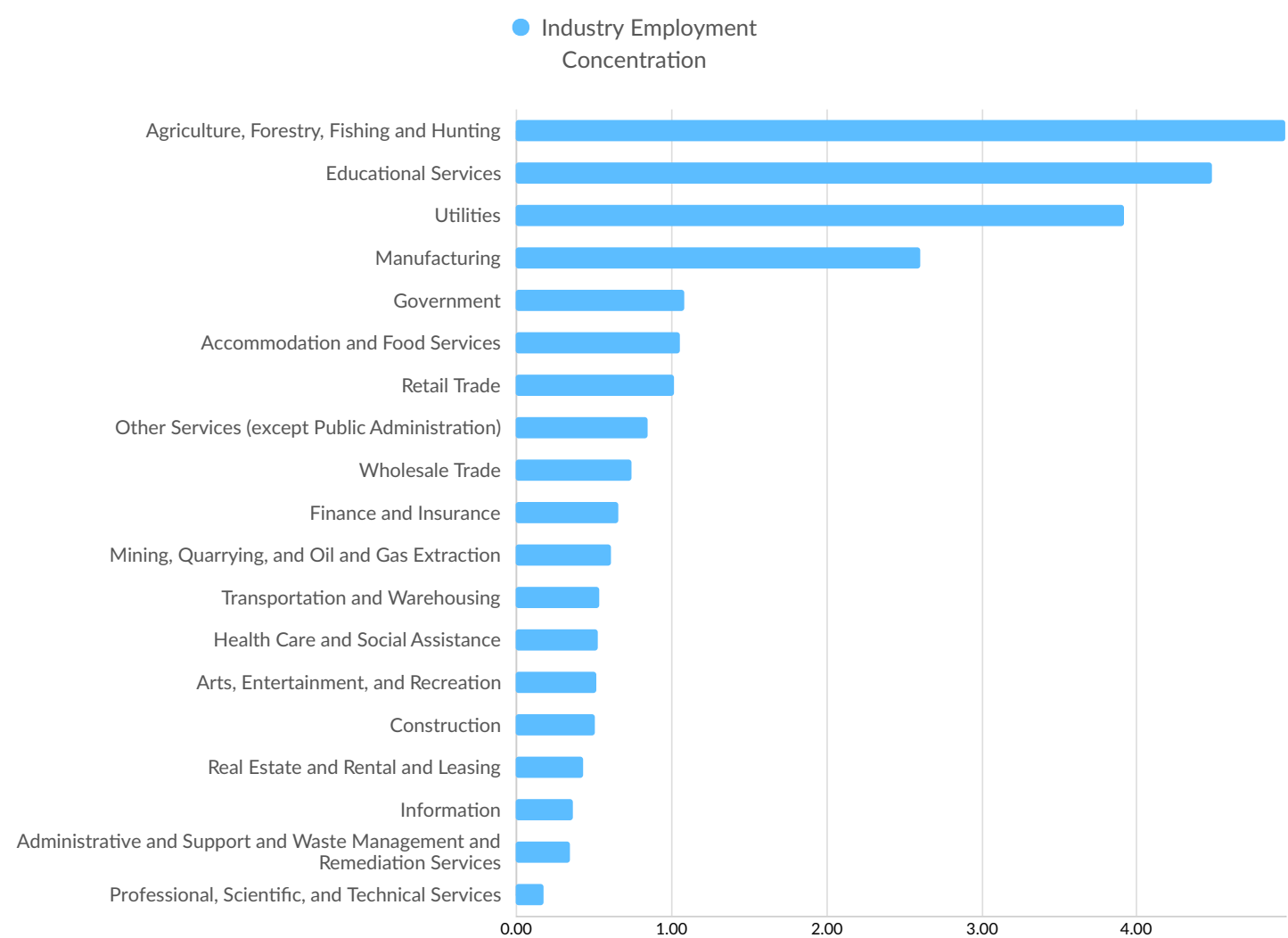

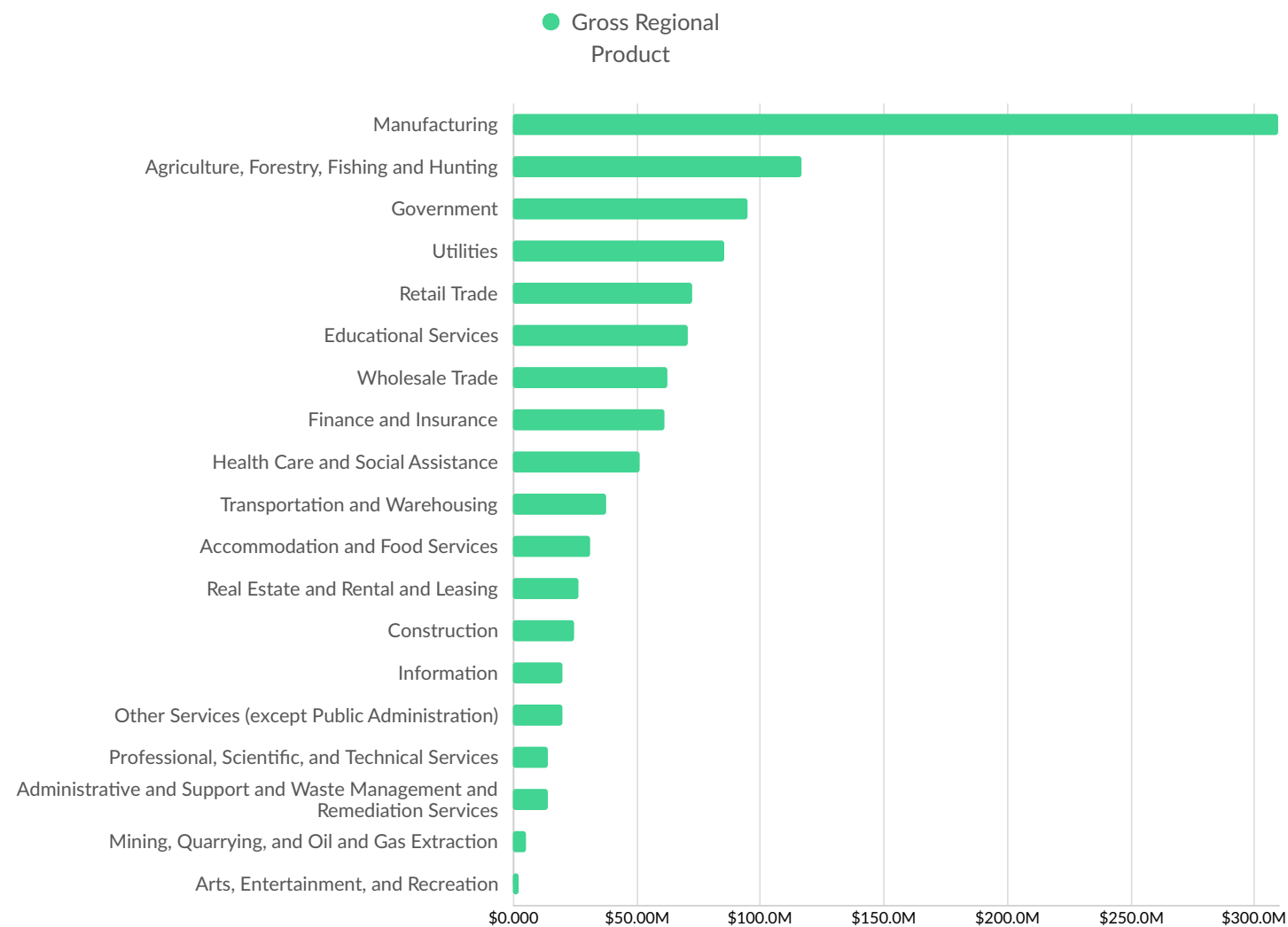
Top Growing Industries



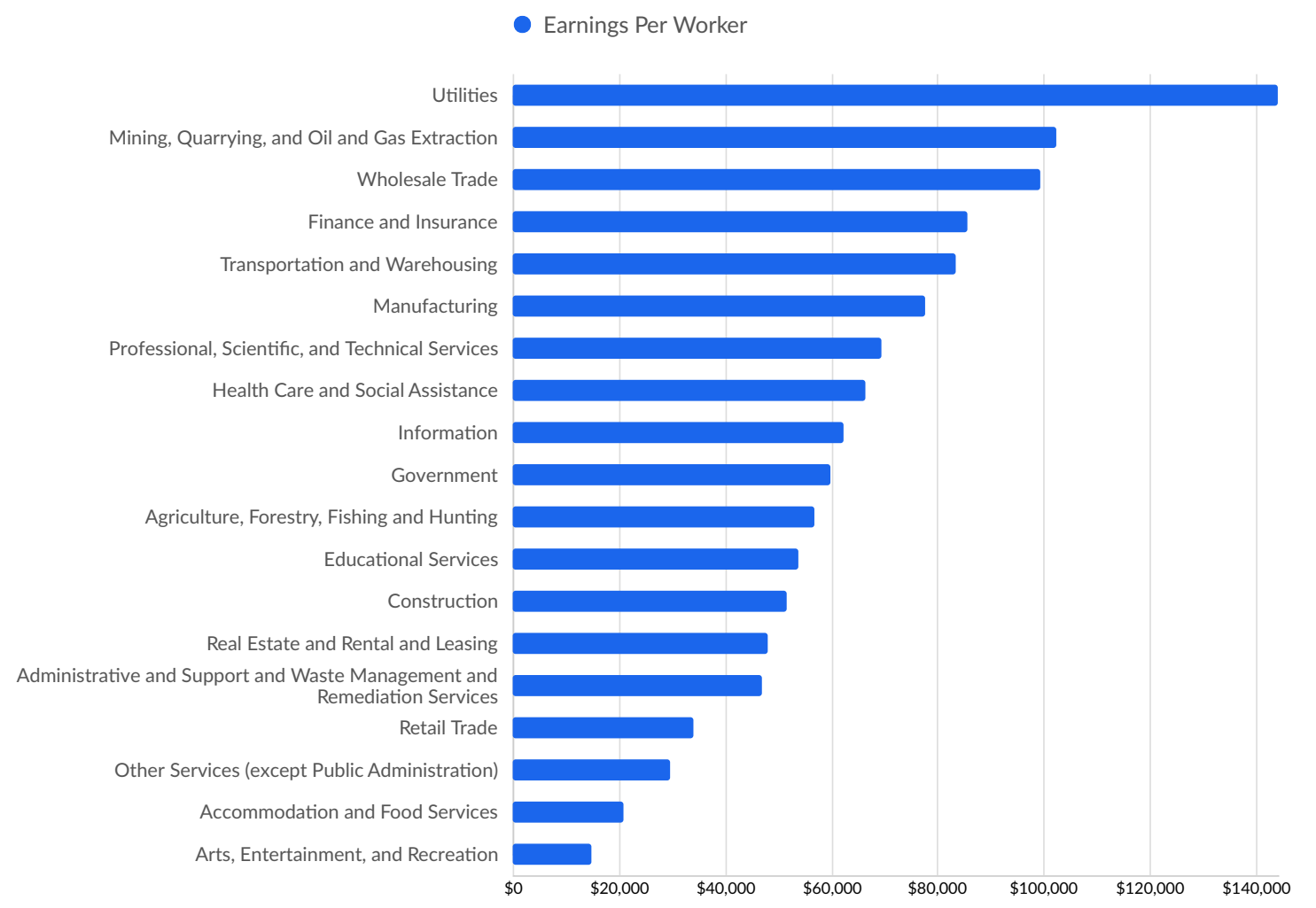
Top Industry Employment Concentration

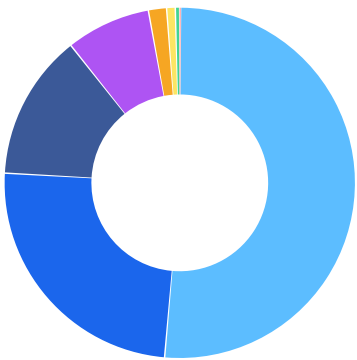

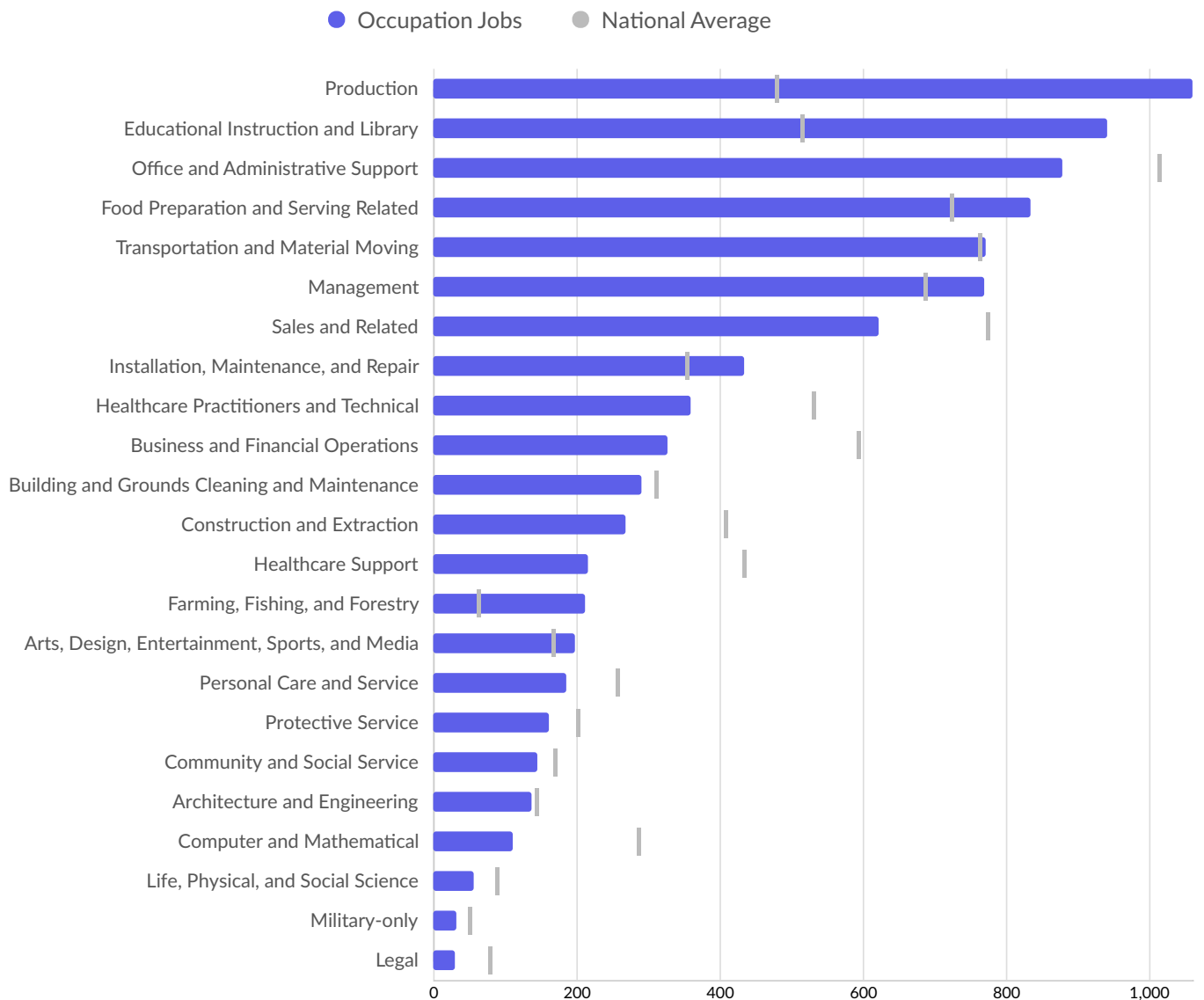

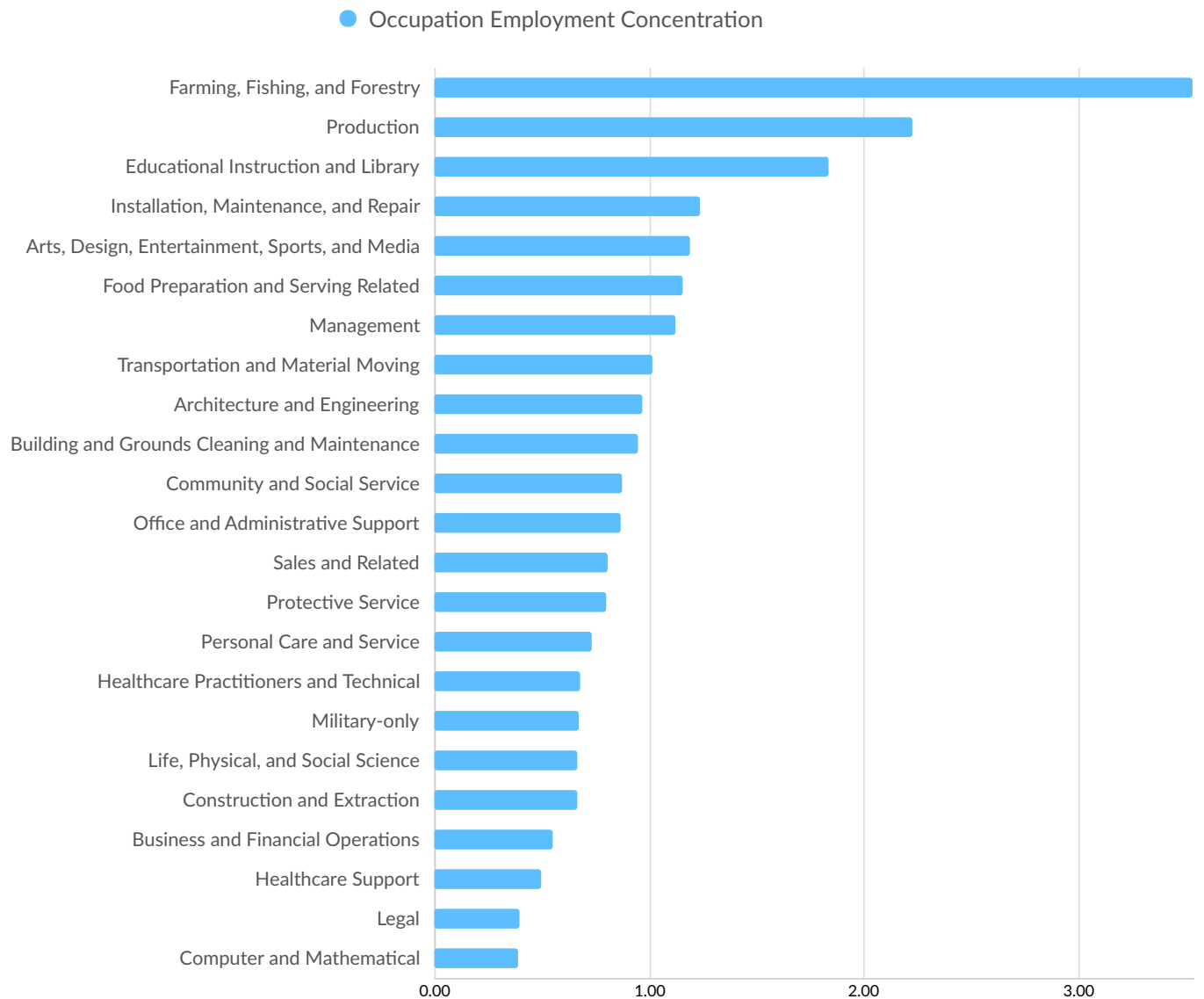

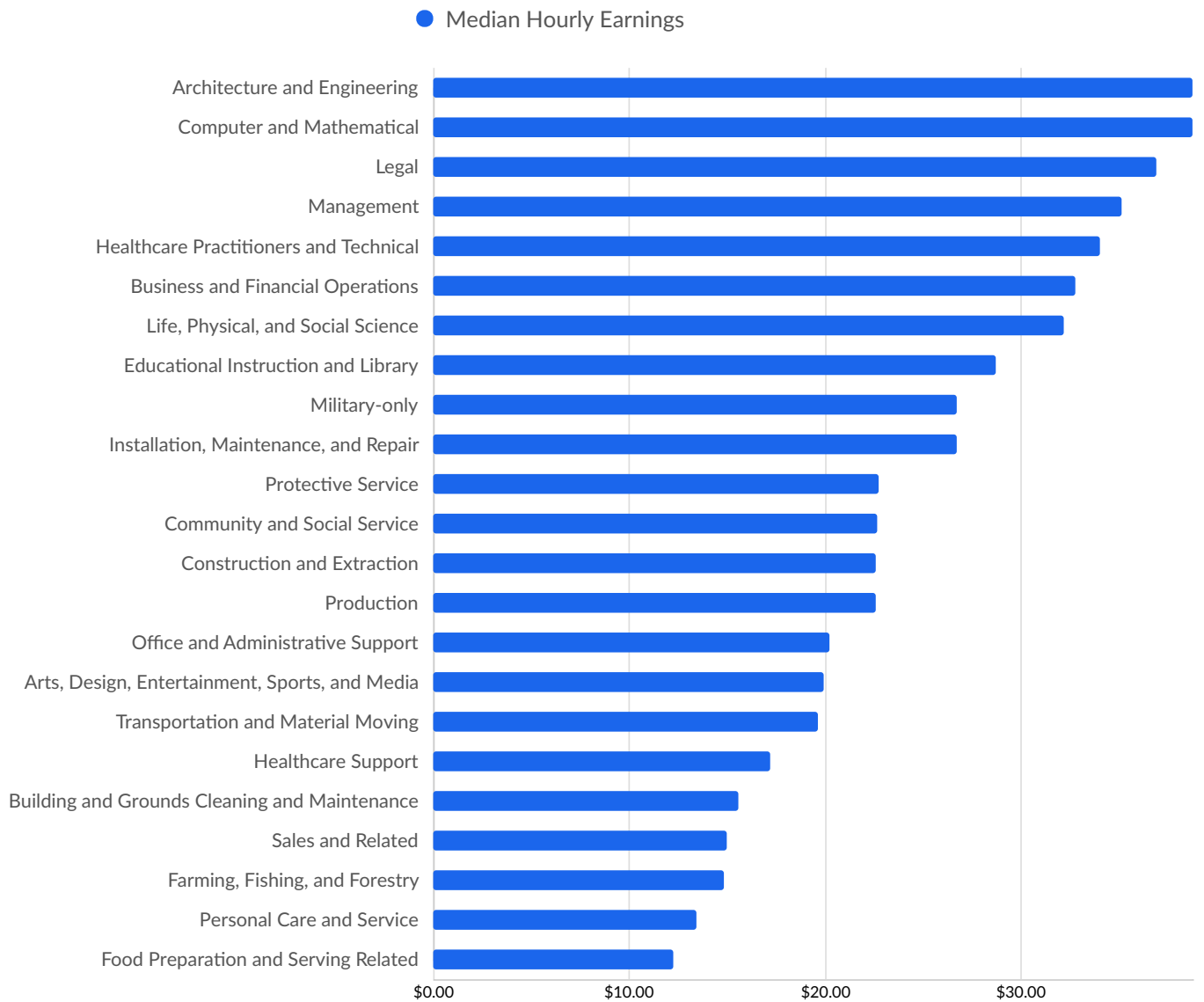
Top Growing Occupations



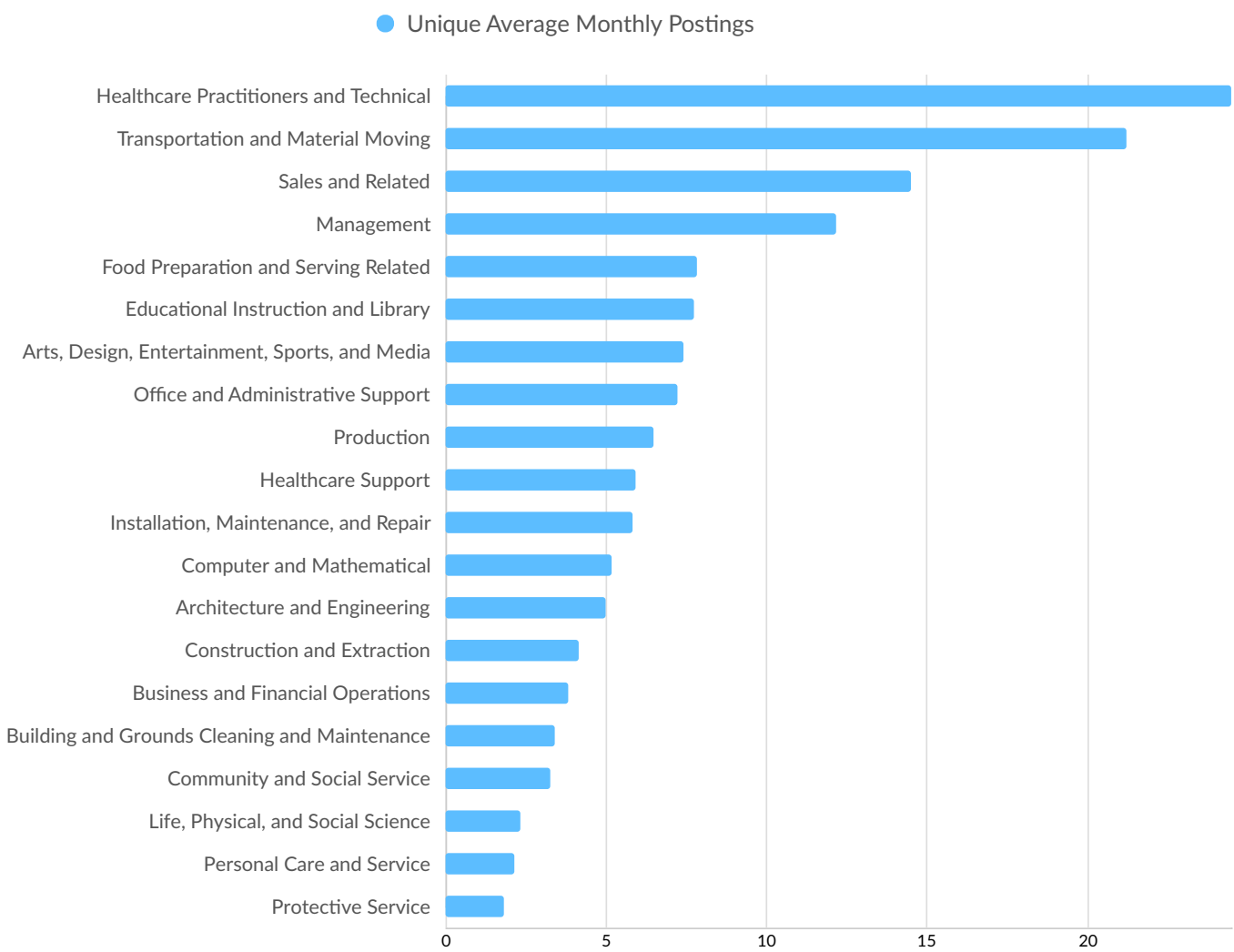
Top Occupation Employment Concentration



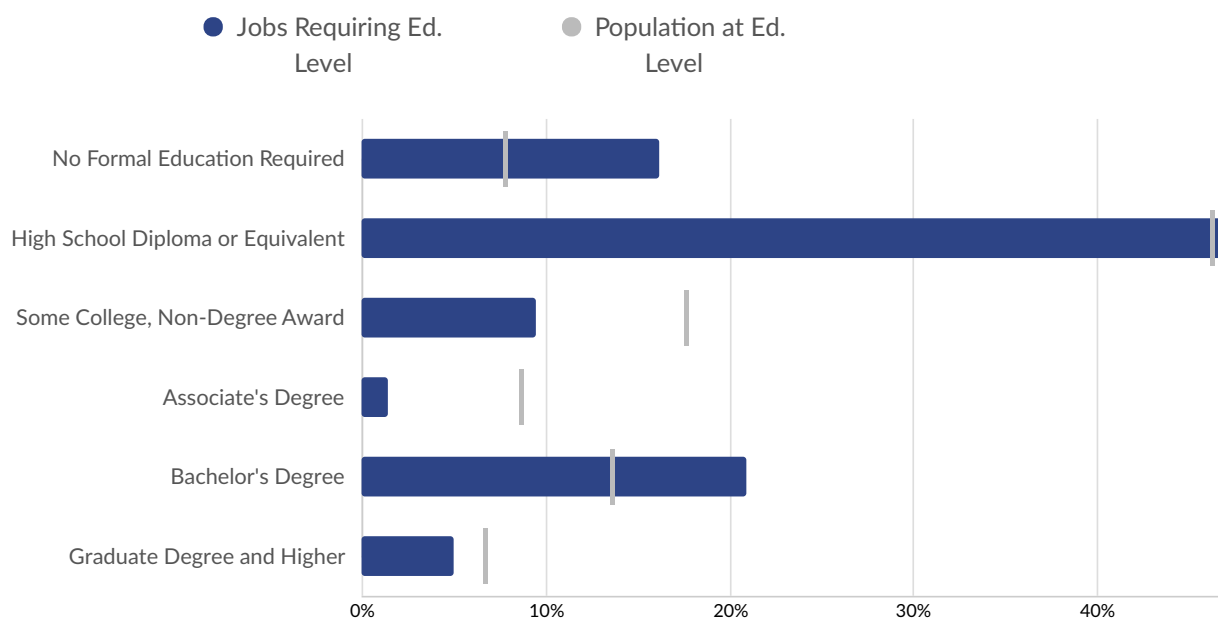

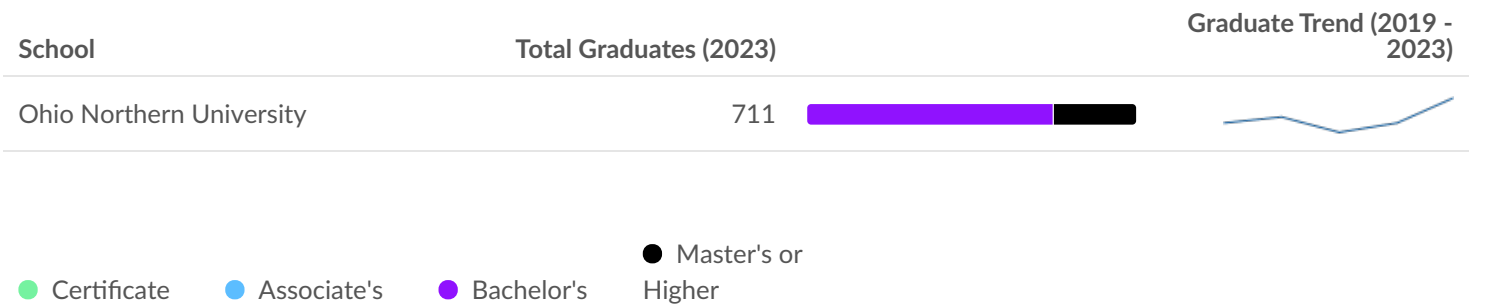
